### **Upcoming Election Deadlines**

The Nebraska Secretary of State's office offers a few reminders about upcoming election deadlines in Nebraska:

Saturday, October 4 - Start of in-person early voting. Most county election offices will be closed, so voting will start on Monday. (Early voting by mail started September 29).

Wednesday, October 8 - First of three public hearings on the minimum wage petition initiative. It will start at 6:30 p.m., College Park Theater Room, 3180 W. Highway 34 in Grand Island.

Wednesday, October 15 - Second public hearing on minimum wage. It will start at 6:30 p.m., Omaha Public Schools Administration Building Board Room, 3215 Cuming Street, Omaha.

Friday, October 17 - Voter registrations that are mailed in must be postmarked by this date. Also, last day voter registrations can be completed at DMV offices, county treasurer offices, state agencies or depart-

Tuesday, October 21 - Third public hearing on minimum wage. It will start at 6:30 p.m., State Capitol Building Room 1507, Lincoln.

Friday, October 24 - Last day to accept in-person voter regis-

#### Fundraising Has Begun for New Seats at Rialto Theatre

movie at the Rialto Theatre in Arnold can tell you that the seats can be small and uncomfortable. The current seats were purchased as used from an auditorium more than 30 years ago. That is all about to change!

The theater will be replacing the current 80 seats with 70 new seats. The tall-backed, 24" wide seats recline, have lift up arm rests and cup holders. These BP1000s are considered the "Cadillac" of theater seats.

The estimated project cost will be approximately \$17,500.00. This cost includes removal of the old seats, the purchase price of the new seats, shipping and installation. The board plans to order 70 new seats at a cost of \$250.00 per seat.

And that is where supporters of the theater come in. The board is hoping that families, individuals and businesses will sponsor the cost of a seat or several seats. Donors may purchase any number of seats: 1, 2, 3 or a row of seats.

A plaque will be placed in the lobby of the theater with the names of those purchasing one or more seats when the goal is met, but no donation is too small or too large.

The fundraising was kicked off in September with a wine tasting at board member Karla Rockwell's country garden. With donations from people who attended and a 10 percent sales donation from vendor Refined Boutique, the fundraiser succeeded in purchasing the first seat.
