Clerk Patty said three counterfeit checks dated Nov. 21, 29, and 30, were deposited totaling \$15,581.77. Aaron Coleman at Pinnacle Bank was notified, a police report has been filed. and the checking account has been closed and a new one opened. As of December 11, one check was returned and the Village was credited \$4,980.88. Pinnacle Bank is working on getting the money returned to the Village from the other two checks.
