"Twelve residents have indicated a need for an eight-car garage, which they think would be sufficient," said Ron Cool, who has been chosen to head the project. "Riverview has some vacancies, and a garage for cars is sometimes a factor in getting new residents. Weather in Nebraska is hazardous to cars that sit outside in hail and the hot sun. Excessive heat and cold ruin paint and interiors. Everyone needs a garage for their car."

Residents chose that location since it is only a few feet away from the apartments and would not interfere with the residents' view to the east. The proposed building would be all metal with a concrete floor. Each unit would have light and two plug-ins. Riverview Apartment board members have indicated rent would be very low, if at all.

The estimated cost of the project will be about \$100,000.00, and Riverview is looking for donations. About \$43,000.00 has been promised to date.
