
Be A Game Changer Fundraiser Brings in Over \$7,000

A copy of One Hundred Years on the South Loup by Norene Hall Mills is being raffled off as part of the "Give 4 County" fundraiser to benefit local projects. The hard-to-find copy has been donated by Dennis Mc-Guire, and the raffle is being sponsored by the Arnold Economic Development Corporation (AEDC). Director Cheryl Carson said if you can find one, the book, which records a century of the Arnold-area's history, can go for \$300.00-\$400.00 on average.

"I've gone through search engines and can't find one for sale. I can find where they've been sold in the past, but none are for sale right now," said Carson.

Raffle tickets will be on sale now through June 30 for \$25.00 for a single ticket, or two or more for \$20.00 each at Finch Memorial Library, Arnold Economic Development, from Aaron Coleman, or Becky at First State Insurance.
