## School Board Approves Agreement for Serving Senior Meals on Mondays, Accepts Member Resignation

At their December 8 regular meeting, Arnold School Board members voted 4-1 to approve a Senior Meals agreement with South Central Area Agency on Aging to serve senior meals on Mondays. Superintendent Joel Morgan said by signing the contract, the school will fill the void on Mondays – a day when Grazers Bar & Grill is closed. The meals will be served starting in January and will only be served during the school year. Both options of carry-out and dine-in will be available. The school is currently working on a schedule of how it will all work.

“Hyannis has been doing this for a couple of years. It’s a good opportunity for folks to be in the building that don’t always make it in,” said Mr. Morgan.

In other action items, the Board accepted the resignation of board member Bryce Nansel. Three years are left on his term. A notice of vacancy is posted in this issue, and a new board member will be appointed to take the spot at the January 13 regular meeting.

Approval was given for the purchase of a minivan from the depreciation fund to Gateway Motors. Mr. Morgan said the van is a replacement through insurance.

Approval was also given for the 2026-2027 and 2027-2028 sports coop agreement with Callaway Public Schools.

## One-Act Team Brings Home State Runner-Up Trophy



The Arnold High School One-Act Team celebrated on December 10, as they received the state runner-up trophy.

Arnold High School earned the Class D-2 runner-up trophy at the State Play Production Championship held at Norfolk on December 10. Arnold garnered 57 points behind state champions St. Mary’s with 59 points. Honorable acting awards went to Noah Anderson, Paxton Bierman, Josie Christensen, Hayden Myers, Eli Rogers, Adalei Tullis, and Luke Tullis.

New head coach Debby Moninger said the performances of the one-act play *All for One* developed throughout the season, and each performance showcased that. The judges raved about the set, costumes, and staging with each performance. At the Johnny Carson Theater performance, judges commented on a dynamic start with fantastic facial expressions, as well as the sword choreography.

“There were definitely adjustments made throughout the season,” said Mrs. Moninger. “Each performance definitely developed based on judges’ critiques, directing team observations, and actor suggestions.”

Some of the scenes that were added over the season included a slow-mo scene where deWinter admits her crimes, and a flower scene where D’Artagnan and Constance show their love for each other. Between districts and state, the main focus was adding emotion by slowing down some of the lines and really emphasizing the characters’ struggles and hopes.

“The senior class did a great job offering and creating energy during performance warm-ups, suggestions on characterization throughout practices, and showing dedication by scheduling focus practices to really develop the character’s emotions. Brook and Serenity were awesome, mentoring the ensemble freezes and hubbub. The entire senior class helped as cast members learned to adjust with a new coaching team,” said Mrs. Moninger.
